- You may have a caller.
- It's a good idea to have someone video the tests for you to take away and review.
- Good opportunity to bring young or new horses out and practice your tests or try out a new one at a higher level or prepare for your next competition.

GENERAL CONDITIONS OF ENTRY (Please read carefully)

- Events will be held in accordance with current 2018 EA Dressage Rules as amended except where FEI Rules apply. The NCEC committee may grant exemptions to the rules for special promotional competitions (see Special Conditions of Entry). **The onus is on competitors to know the rules.**
- **The conditions below are relevant for competitions/events held by NCEC.**
- **Scratching** before close of entries the full entry fee will be refunded.
- **Scratchings** will be accepted up to and including the day of competition. **Refunds:** After the close of entries the club will refund 50% of entry fees when presented with a veterinary or medical certificate within 48 hours of the competition. The compulsory Admin fee is not refundable.
- **DNAs** please show the courtesy of scratching before the day if you are unable to attend the event.
- **Height of horses and ponies:** Refer current 2018 EA Dressage Rules.
- **Stallions:** Effective as of 01 January 2011, the horse (stallion) & Float must display Stallion Identification Discs at all times. Discs are available for purchase from the National Office of Equestrian Australia. Stallions are to be handled as in EA guidelines.
- **Only horses that are entered for a competition or event are permitted on or around the competition grounds during the event.**
- **Riders** may be changed before the start of competition – notification must be in writing at least 40 minutes prior to the start of that competition.
- **Draw position** cannot be changed without the permission of the Organising Committee.
- A competitor may not add a horse to the draw without approval of the Organising Committee
- **Conditions for Riding Attire & Hats** - Riders under 18 must wear an approved safety helmet at all times. Riders training other than warming up for a test must wear an approved safety helmet at all times.
- **Gear Check** – all competitors must present to the Gear Steward. Failure to do so may incur elimination.
- **Warm-up** please use designated warm-up areas, be aware of group riding rules, look where you are going, keep at least 10m from competition arenas. **Lunging** is only allowed in the designated area.
- **Callers** are allowed in all tests.
- **Random swabbing** may take place. If approached by Official Steward / Vet Officer of the day, competitors must allow samples to be taken from their horse for drug tests.
- **Welfare of the horse is paramount** - Refer to current 2018 EA Dressage competition rules.
- **Risk Warning and Disclaimer** - Horse riding is a dangerous activity and can result in serious injury (including death) and loss. All persons who ride or tend a horse at NCEC events do so entirely at their own risk. Neither Equestrian Australia, NCEC nor the committee or any member thereof, accepts any liability for any personal injury (including death) suffered by any person from or relating to any incident involving a horse or contributed to by the negligent act, error or omission of NCEC, the Committee or a member thereof.
